

CUMIS Group adopts feeder stream to creek

To reflect its commitment to the community, CUMIS Group Limited recently invested \$5,000 to adopt two kilometers worth of a stream within its North Service Road property's watershed.

As part of the Bay Area Restoration Council's Adopt-a-Creek program, CUMIS adopted stream number E1, a feeder stream to the Grindstone Creek, which pools into the Hamilton Bay.

"As a significant landowner within the Hamilton Bay Area, this sponsorship is a natural fit with our organization," said Kenn Lalonde, president and CEO of CUMIS.

"Our funding is helping our partners at the Bay Area Restoration Council fulfill their mission to 'Bring Back the Bay' through much-needed water-quality research and analysis."

CUMIS employees lent a hand in the project by volunteering their time alongside Bay Area Restoration Council staff during a day dedicated to the clean up of the adopted stream.

"We were delighted by the enthusiasm of the CUMIS employees, and we look forward to working with them again," said Jim Hudson, executive director of the restoration council.

"This was the first time that our Adopt-a-Creek program has been run with a corporate group, but due to the day's success, we've found a solid future for the program. We hope others are inspired to adopt creeks in their neighbourhoods."
